



## Topper Southern Championships 2022 4th to 5<sup>th</sup> June 2022 Hosted by the National Yacht Club

### SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

#### ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The event will be organised by National Yacht Club (NYC) in conjunction with the International Topper Class Association of Ireland.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule of the sailing instructions means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

#### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Racing rule(s) Signal AP, 33, 35, 60.1(a), 60.1(b), 62.1(a), 61.3, 62.2, A2, A5.1, A5.2 will be changed. The changes are detailed in the notice of race or these sailing instructions.
- 1.3 RRS Appendix P and RRS Appendix T will apply. RRS P2.3 does not apply. RRS P2.2 is changed so that it applies to any penalty after the first one.

#### 2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

#### 3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

#### 4 CODE OF CONDUCT

[DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

#### 5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the flagpole on the NYC Platform
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes in the race signal AP. This changes Race Signal AP.

# ITCA(IRL) Sailing Instructions

5.3 [DP] Flag D with one sound signal means the warning signal will be made not less than 40 minutes after flag D is displayed. Boats shall not leave the shore until this signal is made.

## 7 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be:      5.3 m<sup>2</sup> Fleet    Flag T  
   4.2 m<sup>2</sup> Fleet    Flag Numeral 6

## 8 RACING AREAS

The Sailing Area will be in the environs of Dublin Bay close to Dun Laoghaire Harbour

## 9 THE COURSES

Topper Trapezoid Courses will be used. The diagrams in Attachment A show the courses, including the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

## 10 MARKS

Marks 1 and 4 will be Yellow Cylindrical Marks. Marks 2, 3P and 3S will be Black Cylindrical Marks.

The Start Mark will be a dan buoy with an orange flag or a rib with an orange pole. Finish Marks will be a spherical red mark. A RIB may replace the Finish Mark

Note: The Starting Mark for a subsequent start may be in place while boats are finishing.

## 11 AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

A patrol boat in close attendance to a competitor in difficulty is an obstruction.

## 12 THE START

12.1 The starting line will be between a red and white staff on the committee boat displaying an orange flag at the starboard end and the Orange flag on the Dan buoy or Start Rib at the port end of the line

12.2 A boat that does not start within 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

12.3 [DP] Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.

## 13 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

13.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position.

13.2 Minor Course changes may not be signalled, this changes RRS 33.

## 14 THE FINISH

14.1 The finishing line will be between a red and white staff on the committee boat, which will be displaying a blue flag and the course side of the finish mark.

14.2 A boat that retires before finishing or takes a one-turn or two-turn penalty under RRS 44.2 shall record the details, before the end of protest time, on the declaration form located near the tally board.

## 15 PENALTY SYSTE

## 16 TIME LIMITS

16.1 Boats failing to finish within a 15 minutes finishing window after the first boat in her class sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A5.1 and A5.2.

16.2 In addition to RRS 32, the race committee may also award a finishing score to a boat that is still racing by displaying to her from a committee vessel (which may be in motion) flag W with one sound signal. A boat so notified is no longer required to sail the course, shall stop racing and shall return to the starting area, or return ashore if there is no more racing. A finishing score under this sailing instruction will be the score she would have received had she sailed the course and finished within any time limit, without gaining or losing any place. However, when two or more boats that are overlapped are notified, they will be scored as if they were tied. The decision by the race committee to use this procedure or not to use it shall not be grounds for requesting redress. This changes rules 60.1(b) and 62.1(a).

## 17 HEARING REQUESTS

17.1 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is the later. This changes RRS 61.3 and 62.2.

17.3 Notices will be posted 15 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room downstairs opposite the office. (Granard Room)

## 19 SAFETY REGULATIONS

19.1 [DP] A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

19.2 [DP] All competitors shall tally out and tally in as described at the briefing.

## 20 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

20.1 [DP] [NP] Substitution of competitors is not allowed without prior written approval of the race committee.

20.2 Substitution of damaged or lost equipment is not allowed unless authorised by the race committee. Requests for substitution shall be made at the first reasonable opportunity.

## 21 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

[NP] A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, notice of race and sailing instructions.

## 22 SUPPLIED BOATS

Does not apply.

## 23 OFFICIAL VESSELS

The Committee Boat is a 42 feet cruiser called 'Luna Lady'

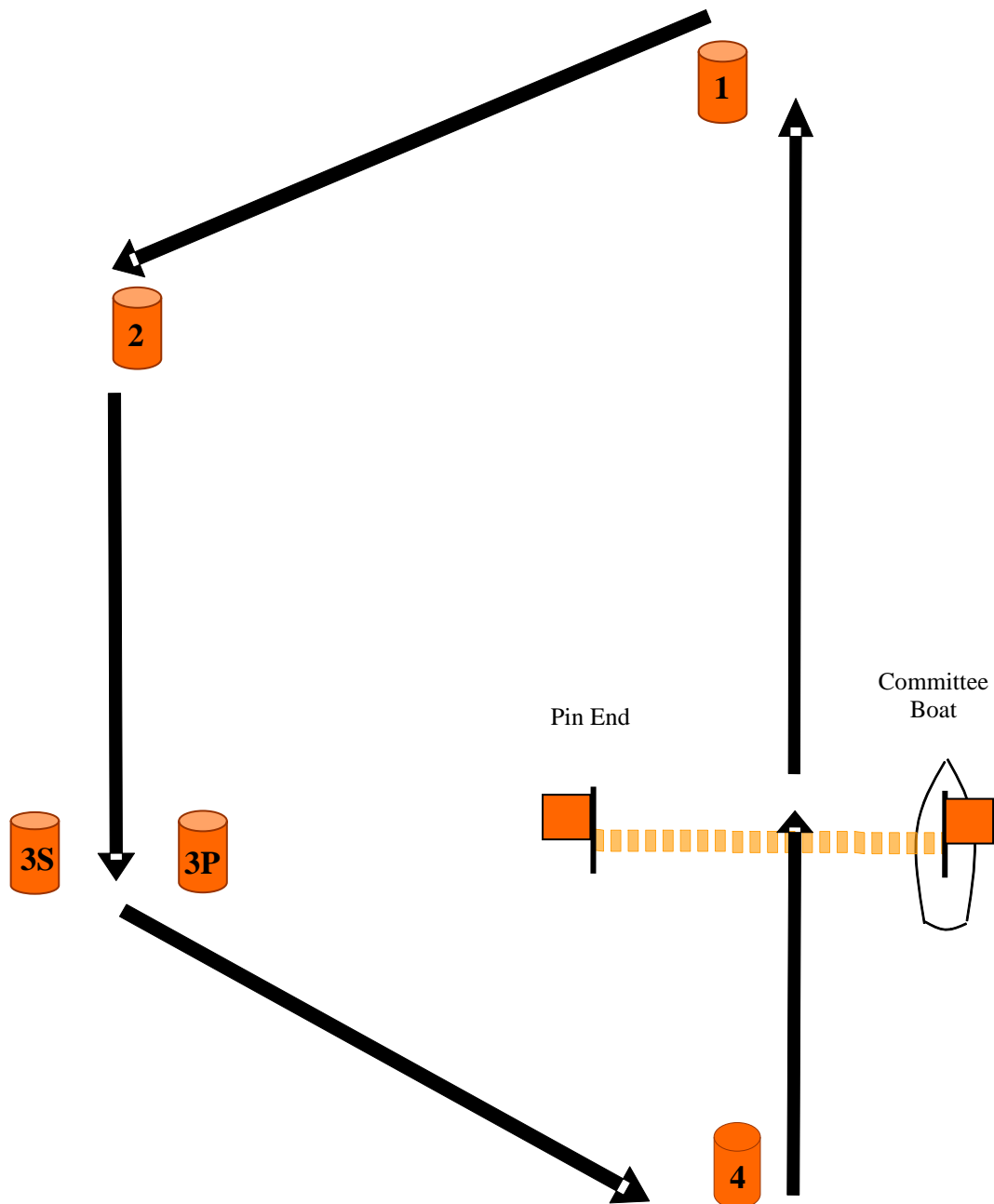
4.2 m<sup>2</sup> Course

Start – 1 – 2 – 3P – 4 – Finish

Marks 1, 2, 3P, 4 are to be rounded to Port

Marks 1 and 4 will be Yellow

Marks 2 and 3s/p will be Back



### 5.3 m<sup>2</sup> Course

Start – 1 – 2 – 3P/3S – 2 – 3P – 4 – Finish

Marks 1, 2, 3P and 4 are to be rounded to Port

Marks 3P/3S are a gate

Marks 1 and 4 will be Yellow

Marks 2 and 3s/p will be Back
